- Bachelor of Science in Business Administration with a specialization in Finance from American University.
- Managed budgeting, financial analysis, and due diligence while working as a Law
   Clerk and Analyst, including increasing firm revenue by 20%.
- As Strategic Pursuit Manager at Bond Civil and Utility, I coordinate cross functional teams on EPC and design-build projects, regularly evaluating pricing strategies and commercial risk, including cash flow analysis and profitability during the pursuit phase.

- Served as Planning Commissioner for the City of Papillion, Nebraska from 2016 to 2024, with direct exposure to zoning, permitting, and community development review.

### 2. Describe any experience you have serving on commercial or non-profit boards. On what committees did you serve?

- I previously served on the Planning Commission for the City of Papillion, Nebraska, a public board responsible for reviewing development proposals and advising on zoning, land use, and infrastructure planning.
- My role involved reviewing staff reports, public testimony, and regional planning data to recommend policy and development decisions to the City Council.
- While not a traditional non-profit board, the commission operates with similar governance and advisory responsibilities, including evaluating the impact of community investments, ordinances, and land use changes.
- Additionally, I have served in leadership roles supporting non-profit committees, including as Co-Chair of Law Week for the Orange County Bar Association, where I helped oversee programming, sponsor outreach, and public events coordination.

- Previously at Kiewit, I held roles in business development, document control, and finance, and helped originate over \$20B in qualified project pursuits.
- Across roles, I have also led trainings, developed onboarding programs, and presented to
  executive teams and clients, demonstrating comfort in both operational and strategic
  leadership.
